BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2016 marks the 29th anniversary of the National Community Development Association's (NCDA) Audrey Nelson Community Development Achievement Awards. In 1987, NCDA established the awards to recognize exemplary uses of CDBG funds. The awards have been expanded to also recognize the HOME program.

Audrey Nelson was the first Deputy Executive Secretary of NCDA. She grew up in an inner city Chicago neighborhood which was a target area for the local Model Cities Program. Her intense commitment to her neighborhood, her local program efforts, and her drive to serve low-income people was cut short by death from cancer at the age of 29.

We are proud to continue these awards in Audrey's name to honor communities which exemplify outstanding achievement in service to neighborhoods and their lower-income residents through their innovative and exemplary use of CDBG (including Section 108) and HOME funds.

CDBG and HOME form the bedrock of federal assistance to local communities. As the second session of the 114th Congress begins in January 2016, let's continue to educate the electorate on the importance of CDBG and HOME and their impact on our communities. Any NCDA member may nominate a qualified program by completing the attached application form. The application deadline is December 11, 2015.

Award recipients, along with their nominating communities, will be notified by December 18, 2015. Awards will be presented during the NCDA Winter Meeting luncheon on Friday, January 22, 2016 at the Holiday Inn Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C.

Only NCDA members are eligible to apply for the award. We strongly encourage communities who have never applied for the award to submit an application.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

Community development projects or programs funded within the last five years with CDBG (including Section 108) and/or HOME funds. The sponsor (NCDA member community) nominates a project or program that operates in a low-income neighborhood or serves lower income populations.

5. **Leveraging.** To what extent has the submission attracted other funding sources? What is the ratio of CDBG and/or HOME dollars to the other project funding sources?
6. **Public Information.** To what extent have you effectively provided the public, the press, local government officials, and your Congressional delegation with information about the project? Have you used innovative methods?
