# City of San Antonio COVID-19 Emergency Housing Assistance Program

- City Council adopted the COVID-19 Emergency Housing Assistance Program in April 2020 to help low-income families impacted by COVID-19 with rent, mortgage and utility assistance.
- Program is an expansion of the City's Risk Mitigation Program.
- A combination of federal funds, City funds, and private donations were used to fund the first two phases of this program.
- City is currently in Phase Three of the COVID-19 Emergency Housing Assistance Program.

## Risk Mitigation Fund Policy

- Adopted in October 2018.
- The fund supports relocation assistance, emergency housing assistance, and provides legal support through the Right to Counsel program.
- The FY2020 Adopted Budget provided \$1 million in General Funds.

### COVID 19 Emergency Housing Assistance Program

- Same eligibility/allowance criteria prescribed in the Risk Mitigation Fund Policy.
- Households must have a COVID related crisis.
- Allowable uses for the funds expanded to include groceries, fuel, and expenses related to internet access.
- Funds for rental, mortgage, internet, and utility assistance will be paid directly to the landlord, financial institution, internet provider, and utility provider.
- Assistance for groceries and gas distributed directly to the family
  - Amount determined based on family size but will not exceed \$300 (non-federal funds used for this assistance).

### Requests for Housing Assistance

- In April 2020, the City was receiving 5,000 requests per week for housing assistance.
  - Increased staff from 8 to 41 (City staff).
  - Procured software to help process the applications more quickly.
  - Added 30 temp staff and moved operations to Central Library in June 2020.
  - Partnered with community organizations to conduct application intake
  - Program marketing and outreach through door hangers, television ads, social media, and flyers.
  - Established eviction court support team


