Our Statistical Programs-Overview

Censuses:

- The **Decennial Census** is the once-a-decade population and housing count required by the U.S. Constitution
- The **Economic Census** measures the nation's economy every five years
- The **Census of Governments** provides comprehensive data about state and local governments in the nation every five years.

Surveys:

- The **American Community Survey (ACS)** is an ongoing annual survey that shows what the U.S. population looks like and how it lives.
- **Demographic surveys** measure income, poverty, education, and many other subjects.
- **Economic surveys** are conducted monthly, quarterly, and yearly.
- **Sponsored surveys** are demographic and economic surveys, including the Current Population Survey.

Population Estimates and Projections

- Every year, the Census Bureau publishes population estimates and demographic components of change, such as births, deaths, and migration.

The Decennial Census Shapes America for the Next 10 Years



The U.S. Constitution (Article 1, Section 2) requires a census every 10 years to determine state representation in the U.S. Congress.

Federal funding—**more** than \$675 billion a year—is allocated based on the census.

This funding affects vital local services, including:

- Education
- Housing
- Transportation
- Health care

Census data is used by businesses, governments, and civic organizations to inform decision-making.

2020 Census Timeline

The count is now complete, and the Census Bureau is currently processing the data, making sure that everyone is counted once, only once, and in the right place. Here's a look at some of the key **upcoming** dates, as they are currently scheduled:

Apportionment: As close to December 31, 2020, as possible: The Census Bureau will deliver population counts used for apportionment to the president as required by law.

Redistricting: As close to April 1, 2021, as possible: By this date, the Census Bureau will send redistricting counts to the states. This information is used to redraw legislative districts based on population changes.

The American Community Survey

- The nation's most current, reliable, and accessible data source for local statistics on critical planning topics such as age, children, veterans, commuting, education, income, and employment
- Surveys **3.5 million** households and informs over **\$675 billion** of Federal government spending each year
- Covers **35+ topics**, supports over **300** evidence-based Federal government uses, and produces **11 billion** estimates each year
- Three key annual data releases:
 - 1-year Estimates (for large populations)
 - 1-year Supplemental Estimates (for small populations)
 - 5-year Estimates (for very small populations)






Census Economic Surveys

- Census Bureau Economic Surveys are a key source for official statistics companies can use:
 - Monthly and Quarterly are small sample surveys that provide the most **TIMELY** data available
 - Annual surveys have larger samples and provide the most up-to-date **TREND** data available
 - Every 5 years, the Economic Census measures all businesses and provides the most **COMPREHENSIVE** data available
- These surveys set the standard for U.S. economic statistics, and are fueled by the data provided by individual businesses


Economic Indicators

 - Monthly, including:
 - Retail Trade Survey, Building Permits, and Exports/Imports
 - Quarterly, including:
 - Quarterly Financial Report; Quarterly Services Survey





U.S. Beer Exports and Imports (\$US)





U.S. Beer Exports - Top 10 Countries (February 2020) (\$US)

- Serve as public-sector counterpart to private sector data
- Response is voluntary
- Virtually no confidentiality restriction – data is public record
- Core Program Content
 - Organization and Structure
 - Government Employment
 - Government Finances
- Released on data.census.gov, Excel files, and other Census tools

The Economic Census

- NAICS: **Every** 2- thru 6-digit code covered by the Census Bureau
 - Excludes Agriculture (NAICS 11) and other selected types of business (see https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/economic-census/guidance/understanding-naics.html#par_textimage for full list of exclusions)
- Geography: Provides data at the national, state, metro area, county, and **place** levels
- Other Dimensions: Provides data by **business size** (estab and firm; employment and revenue), **Legal Form of Organization**, **Franchise status**, etc.
- Over **200 data variables** shown, including “core” variables shown in current programs (establishments, employment, payroll) plus sector-specific variables (inventories, assets, expenses, etc.)
- **Product Lines** data (NAPCS data)




