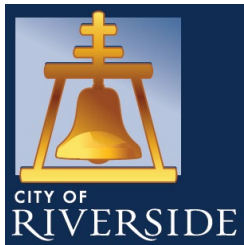

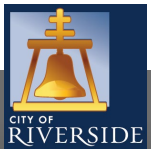

City of Riverside, California

The City of Riverside receives its share of CDBG funding from the federal Housing and Urban Development Department (HUD) to address a wide range of community development needs from neighborhood improvements to public services to economic development to affordable housing to name just a few.

At the City of Riverside CDBG funds are managed by the Housing and Human Services Department (HHS) CDBG/Grants Division and distributed according to community needs through an Annual Action Plan process. The community, City Council, and City staff have an opportunity to provide input. Funds are then allocated to various nonprofit organizations and City departments to implement needed activities. The City receives an approximate annual allocation of \$2.8M and funds approximately 30-40 local nonprofits annually.

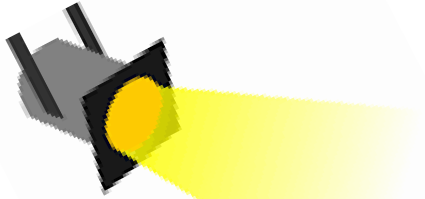
