Job Order Contracting by the Numbers



Job Order Contracting (JOC) Definition

Indefinite delivery / indefinite quantity (IDIQ) contract

Enables contractors to complete a substantial number of individual projects with a single bid

Tasks are based on guaranteed, preset prices

Program Implementation

The Job Order Contract is solicited in accordance with your state's statutory requirements. Contractors bid a multiplier to be applied to the Construction Task Catalog[®] of preset unit prices developed using local labor, material and equipment costs. Job Order Contracts are generally awarded to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder(s). Once a contract is awarded, the contractor can perform a variety of projects. The contractor is paid the preset unit price X the quantity ordered X the competitively awarded adjustment factor. No negotiation required.
