



**SENATE CO-SPONSORS NEEDED FOR S.2700.
ARE BOTH OF YOUR SENATORS ON THIS LIST?**

The Brownfields Revitalization and Environmental Restoration Act of 2000, or S. 2700, is a bill that provides targeted liability reform and \$150 million in federal aid for the remediation urban and rural brownfields. It is being promoted by a bi-partisan group of senators who serve on the chamber's Environment and Public Works Committee. Despite the fact that there is wide support for this legislation throughout the Senate, right now this important legislation is in serious need of additional co-sponsors in order to prevent it from being shelved by a backroom deal (see related article in *The Washington Report*). If any of your U.S. Senators are not on this list, please contact their office immediately and ask them to co-sponsor S.2700. This bill represents the first good chance in a long time to get action at the national level to deal seriously with the problem of brownfields remediation.
