Dear Majority Leader Reid and Madam Speaker Pelosi:

The undersigned organizations representing local elected officials, local and State community development practitioners, and nonprofit organizations write to ask for your support for \$10 billion in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds as part of the economic stimulus package currently under consideration. Because of its flexibility and emphasis on local decision-making, the CDBG program has been used in the past to disseminate funds quickly to areas impacted by disasters or facing economic turmoil.

In the current economic downturn, we can think of no better program than CDBG to provide jurisdictions with a much needed injection of funds to support local infrastructure projects and economic and community development activities. These projects will stimulate local economies by creating and retaining jobs, supporting local businesses, and increasing State and local governments' revenue bases. Moreover, every dollar of CDBG funding has traditionally leveraged another three dollars in private and public investment. These leveraged funds will further help to spur the investment needed to revitalize the lagging economy.

Again, we urge you to support the inclusion of \$10 billion in CDBG funding, to be distributed according to the existing program, in the next economic stimulus package. Thank you for your consideration of our request.
