### **Full-Time Lecturer in Housing Policy and Planning, MIT Department of Urban Studies and Planning**

#### **Description**

The Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) is hiring a full-time Lecturer in Housing and Planning within its Department of Urban Studies and Planning (DUSP). This position will teach graduate level courses in housing policy and housing planning with an emphasis on affordable housing, advise students, and participate in other departmental responsibilities. MIT is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of the academic community through their research, teaching and/or practice and public service. DUSP is dedicated to building a culturally diverse and pluralistic faculty and strongly encourage applications from members of under-represented groups and women. This is a full-time two year non-tenured track position as Lecturer for the period of September 2009 through May 2011.

The person hired will be expected to teach professional degree candidates in city planning, advise masters-level students on their academic program and masters' theses, and supervise field-based projects related to affordable housing policy and planning. The Department seeks a dynamic and creative teacher with a strong record as a practicing professional or in policy research in affordable housing policy, planning or development.

**Minimum Qualifications:** Masters, JD, or PhD or other advanced degree in planning, public policy or related field; 5 to 10 years professional or research experience in affordable housing planning or policy; prior teaching experience in professional development or at a graduate level.
